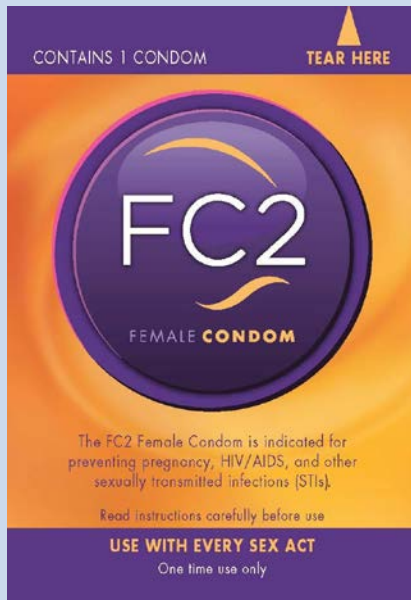

Preventive Health Services

All non-grandfathered private plans *must* cover preventive oddslot services *without* charging patients a copayment or coinsurance.

Contraceptives and contraceptive counseling are included.

Regardless of yearly deductible.

ACA

Must cover FDA–approved methods of contraception.

2013 FAQ

Must cover *a full range of* FDA–approved contraceptive methods.

2015 FAQ

Must cover at least one form of contraception in **each of the 18 method category.**

IS THE FEMALE CONDOM RIGHT FOR YOU?

There are many birth control options and it is important to find the one that fits your needs and lifestyle.

The female condom:

- ▶ provides protection from unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases,
- ▶ is latex-free and lubricated with a silicone-based lubricant inside and out; and
- ▶ is a “backup” option while waiting for a new birth control method to take effect.

Talk with your health care provider today to find out if the female condom is the birth control for you.

You may be eligible for free female condoms – flip this card over to learn how.

FEMALE CONDOM BILLING FACT SHEET

Using the female condom during sexual intercourse can help protect against sexually transmitted diseases (STDs, including HIV) and unintended pregnancies. Additionally, the female condom offers the advantage of being a female-controlled prevention method.

Contraceptive Coverage in Commercial Insurance

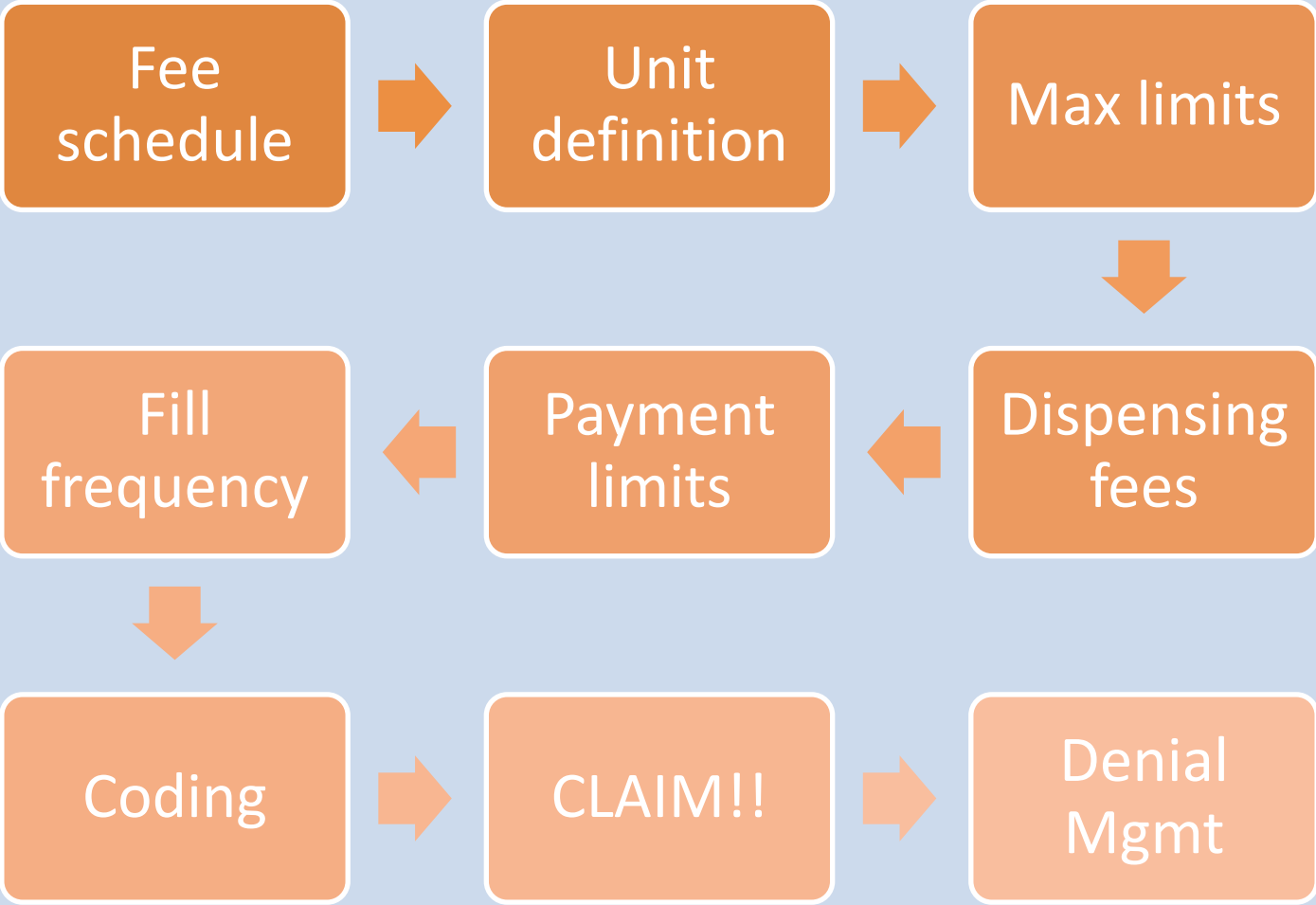
Under the ACA, all new insurance plans (both individual and employer-sponsored) are required to cover all FDA-approved methods of contraception, sterilization, and related education and counseling without cost-sharing, including the female condom.¹ “No cost-sharing” means that patients should not have any out-of-pocket costs, including payment of deductibles, co-payments, co-insurance, fees, or other charges for coverage of contraceptive methods. Patients cannot be asked to pay upfront and then be reimbursed.

Contraceptive Coverage in Medicaid

serve as an important source of contraceptive coverage for many low-income individuals who are not eligible for full-benefit Medicaid. However, states have flexibility when defining the specific package of services and supplies that are covered within these programs. Providers should consult their state’s Medicaid provider manual or state Medicaid agency to determine specific coverage of the female condom in their state.²

Many states rely on managed care delivery systems to administer part or all of the state’s Medicaid benefits. While most managed care arrangements require Medicaid enrollees to obtain services from a specific network of providers, enrollees can seek covered family planning services from any Medicaid-participating provider. **Providers should review their individual contracts with Medicaid managed**

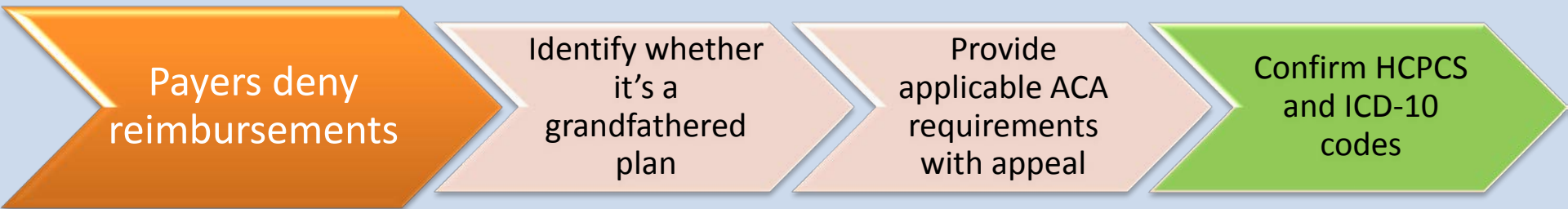
The ACA requires that all non-grandfathered group health plans and health insurance issuers offering group or individual coverage provide coverage of and not impose cost sharing for certain preventive services for women. (ACA § 1001, amending § 2713 of Public Health Service Act.) The list of women's preventive services which must be covered in plan years starting after Aug. 1, 2012 includes "all Food and Drug Administration approved contraceptive methods, sterilization procedures, and patient education and counseling for all women with reproductive capacity." (<http://www.hrsa.gov/womensguidelines/>) These methods are listed in the Food and Drug Administration's "Birth Control Guide."

Reimburse for dispensing

- FP Provider in WI
 - Female condom included in FP Waiver/SPA since 2003
 - Support from state health official
 - Reimbursed \$3.44
 - Medical benefit
 - Use CPT A4268

Writing a prescription

- NP Provider in MA
 - Provided prescriptions to patients in both FP clinic and general community health clinic
 - Goal was to assess interest from patients and acceptability of prescription
 - Response was strong.
